

## Use Your Senses Scavenger Hunt

- Listen for the sound of a bee
- Listen to the sound of the wind through the trees
- Listen for the sound of a duck
- Listen to the sound of dry leaves under your feet
- Listen for the sound of a squirrel
- Listen for the sound of a frog
- Listen for a songbird (do you know who is making the noise?)
  
- Smell the mud or sand
- Smell a flower
- Smell a tree
- Smell green grass
- Smell old leaves
  
- Feel wet mud or sand
- Feel a prickly plant (gently, don't poke yourself)
- Feel two different kinds of tree bark
- Feel a piece of decaying wood
  
- Watch an ant moving something
- Watch a spider web with an insect in it (remember not to touch)
- Watch an animal eating
- Watch ducks or geese taking off or landing on a lake or pond

Take a walk outside and use your senses to help you complete this scavenger hunt. There are a few things to remember when you are out and about.

1. Please leave everything as you found it. If you find something interesting or exciting, look at it, but leave it behind so that the next person can see it as well.
2. Please try not to disturb anything. Many plants are food and homes for other living creatures, so be careful when you explore.
3. Please be aware that it is illegal to remove, deface, injure or destroy plants, fossils and rocks in provincial/state/national parks.
4. For your own safety, and to protect the local wildlife, please do not approach, harass, or attempt to feed wild animals ( this includes seagulls ! ) These actions may cause a wild animal to feel threatened, and a threatened animal can pose a danger to humans and/or their pets.
